

**Applicants must:** 

- 1.Be a current OSRT member in good standing.
- 2. Submit the online application by May 15
  - Attach a professional CV or Resume to the online application.
  - Verify degree and/or certification status by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (or equivalent medical imaging certification) by either diploma or certification.
  - Submit a non-refundable application fee of \$50.00 at the time of application for Fellows.
  - Verify past or present professional organization membership(s).
- 3. Achieve a score of 75 or more during the Fellows committee's evaluation using the Fellows Status Point Scale Rubric.

Selected candidates will be elevated to Fellows status at the Fellows Ceremony during the Francine Todd Memorial Honors Reception at the Annual Meeting of each year (September). Elevated Fellows will be presented with an award at the ceremony.



It was with regret the O.S.R.T. Board of Directors accepted the resignation of Jack C. Malott, R.T.(R) as Junior Member of the Board of Directors. Increased responsibilities at work, chairmanship of the Editorial Committee of the A.H.R.A. and a desire to spend more time with his family, prompted the decision. The Board of Directors would like to thank Jack for his numerous contributions to the society.

Other business of interest transacted at the Mid Year Board meeting is summarized below:

- 1. It was determined to allow the membership to determine the voting status of the Continuing Education Coordinators on the Board of Directors. This will be accomplished with a proposed bylaw change which can be found in this issue.
- 2. Proposed bylaw changes will be voted on at the Annual Meeting as a result of the resignation of a board member. These can be found in this issue, also.

- 3. The Public Relations Committee will begin having two staggered co-chairpersons to better enable the committee to promote National Radiologic Technology Week (NRTW), which usually follows the annual meeting. This committee will distribute TV and radio public service announcements to local societies, and contribute NRTW buttons at the annual meeting.
- 4. It was finalized that the 1989 and 1990 Education Meetings will be held in Columbus in an attempt to centralize our largest meeting and help keep costs low through long-term hotel contracts. This is an experiment which will be evaluated by the Board. Please provide us with input on this matter.

On the legislative front, Bill Finney, and our lobbyist, Fred Vierow, continue to negotiate with groups who oppose our bill. We hope to have the bill redrafted before the annual meeting. While hopes of a licensure in 1988 are dim, the candle is still flickering. The hope for licensure in 1989 is promising, as many of our problems are being resolved this year. Please contact your Senator and indicate the status of the bill and the fact that we are trying to meet the needs of our opposition. If this issue takes off this summer, I will be in contact with each of you for that help we will need to make licensure a reality in Ohio.

I would encourage everyone to attend the 1988 Annual Meeting, to join in the celebration of our 50th Anniversary. Several special events are planned. As you are probably aware, the meeting will be held in Independence, Ohio (Greater Cleveland area). I urge you to attend as there are several important pieces of business to be taken care of, including bylaw changes and a discussion on licensure. I look forward to seeing each of you there.

This is my last opportunity to address the membership via the Buckeye Rays. Thus far, I have enjoyed the Office of President and I would like to thank the members for giving me the opportunity to serve in this capacity. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to comtact me.


