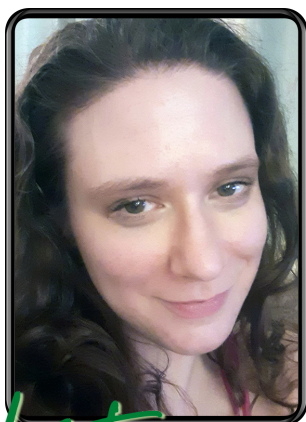
If you're a second year and forgot to register for the exam, it's not too late! Contact the OSRT Executive Secretary to have it added to your event registration.

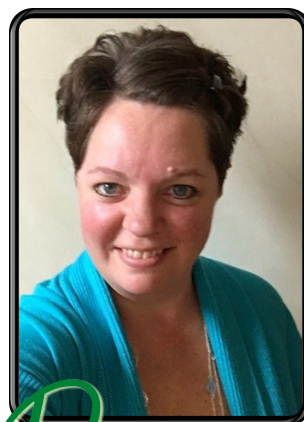
Pre-registration is not required for the Student Open Forum.

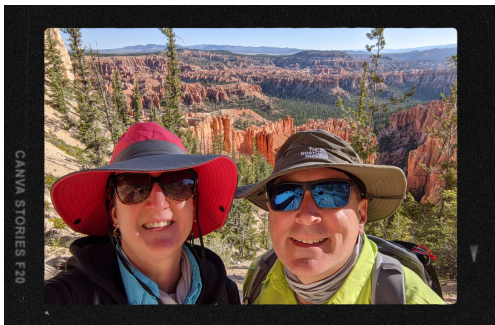

How Can Mentoring Work for You?

Robin R. Williams MBA, R.T.(R)

The title of Robin's presentation is "How Can Mentoring Work for You?" The presentation will provide information regarding the impact of mentoring, and its' impact on the student, faculty, and advisors. Improved retention rate is a significant characteristic of the mentored radiography learner. This study will motivate faculty and advisors to use their influence to not only encourage mentoring, but to be receptive to the role as a mentor beyond their general responsibilities. Programs may also be affected by improved student outcomes. Her goal in presenting this information is to bring focus to the outcome of mentoring, who it affects, and the motivation behind the results.

Human Trafficking

Eric Higgins, M.S.



Eric J Higgins, MS, has been teaching Criminology, Criminal Justice, and Forensics, classes in higher education for thirteen years. Detective Higgins has been working in law enforcement for twenty-four years.

Detective Higgins is currently working for the City of Elsmere, Kentucky as their lead detective. Detective Higgins retired (December, 2019) from the Covington Police Department's Crime Bureau as the financial crimes/homicide investigator, was assigned to the United States Secret Service Task Force and the United States Marshal's Fugitive Task Force. Detective Higgins was previously assigned to the Federal Bureau of Investigations task force. Detective Higgins was previously assigned the sex offender caseload investigating and monitoring their compliance with registration laws, and has worked in the Crime Suppression Unit as a Narcotics Detective investigating VICE crimes.

Detective Higgins holds a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice and a Bachelor of Science in Sociology. Detective Higgins is a Certified Peace Officer, Law Enforcement Officer Advanced Investigator, and Certified Crisis Intervention Officer. In July of 2015 Detective Higgins was selected to present to the American Probation and Parole Association, at the 40th Annual Training in Los Angeles, California. He was recruited for this national training event to co-present an End Slavery 101 workshop, titled: From Victim to Offender: The Response to Human Trafficking in Probation and Parole. This workshop amassed approximately 300 criminal justice professionals including Judges and policy makers. The presentation garnered continued interest by professionals in the field and requests for additional anti trafficking presentations at regional events within the U.S and Internationally.

Imaging the Diabetic Patient

Diabetes Mellitus is an inability of the body to control glycemic levels that may lead to negative effects on multiple organ systems if uncontrolled through lifestyle and/or medications. While Diabetes is of global concern, nearly half the population of the United States are considered prediabetic or diabetic. Diabetic patients may require extensive healthcare services including imaging for screening, diagnosis, and treatment. Understanding the physiology of insulin and glucose, devices and medications used to control diabetes, and common diabetic imaging procedures will guide the radiologic technologist to proper care of these patients.

Kelly Dragomir is an Associate Lecturer at Kent State University - Salem Campus. She has served as an instructor for the Radiologic Technology and Computed Tomography programs since 2012. She earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Biology followed by a Master of Arts degree in Biology from Kent State University. Kelly is currently a Registered Radiologic Technologist with additional certification in Computed Tomography.

Receptors to the Rescue: Antidotes & Overdose

In the last few years, the amount of drug overdoses has skyrocketed. As key healthcare professionals, radiologic technologists are often on the front line in these clinical scenarios. A key understanding of drug overdose, symptoms, and treatment will help professionals understand what is occurring in each step and help assist inpatient care.

Beyond the Tremor: Personalizing Parkinson's Disease

Parkinson's disease the most common neurological movement disorder. It is a progressive neurodegenerative disorder of aging that affects both motor & cognitive function. There are quite a few medications to treat the symptoms & emerging technologies for treatment as well. These patients are frequently encountered by radiology personnel. An understanding the pathophysiology of this disease is of utmost importance to caring for these patients in the best way possible. Through the personal story of a Parkinson's Disease patient & their caregiver, many of these aspects will be discussed.

Dr. Weber graduated from COTC in 2005 and OSU with a nontraditional bachelor's in 2007. She worked as a CT technologist at Grant Medical Center and Fairfield Medical Center and was involved with numerous quality and safety projects when working at FMC. Mara then graduated from the Ohio State University in 2012 with her Doctorate of Pharmacy. She has served in various positions within OhioHealth including helping open the first free-standing emergency room in the system at the Westerville Campus.



She is working at Grant Medical Center and since 2019, has been the Medication Safety & Antimicrobial Stewardship Pharmacist for O'Bleness Memorial & Berger Hospitals. As the medication safety pharmacist for the site she has focused on integration and implementation of OhioHealth best practices for safe medication administration.

My focus is on education of safe medication practices and understanding. One of these focuses has been being involved with presentations at multiple OSRT conferences and lectures for students at COTC. This is a huge passion of mine to help bridge the gap in the medication use process for all healthcare providers. Through helping others understand medications we can better patient care & outcomes.

This year I am giving a talk on Overdose/Antidotes & Parkinson's. This year is extremely special to me as I can honor my father that I lost to Parkinson's this past summer. He experienced numerous adverse medication events throughout his 10 year journey and I hope through my work I can honor him and help others avoid the issues we encountered.

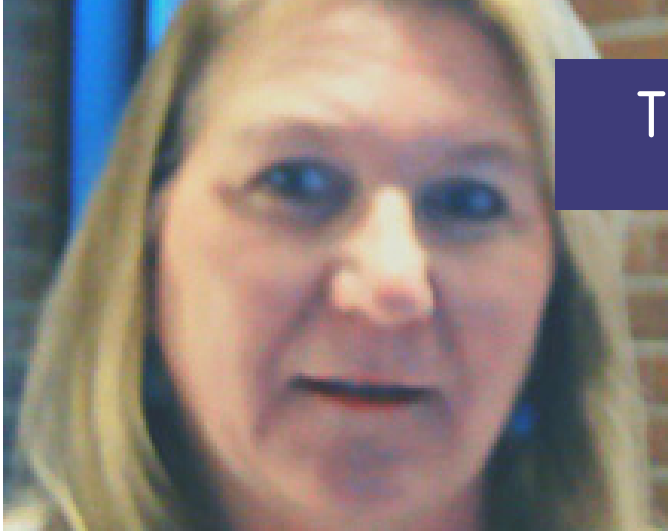
