Fellows is an honorary designation representing a significant breadth and depth of contribution to the OSRT and the medical imaging and radiation therapy profession. A Fellows is an exemplary leader who has consistently served, advocated for, and supported the advancement of the profession.

Applicants must:

1.Be a current OSRT member in good standing.

2. Submit the online application by January 31

- Attach a professional CV or Resume to the online application.
- Verify degree and/or certification status by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (or equivalent medical imaging certification) by either diploma or certification.
- Submit a non-refundable application fee of \$50.00 at the time of application for Fellows.
- Verify past or present professional organization membership(s).
- 3. Achieve a score of 75 or more during the Fellows committee's evaluation using the Fellows Status Point Scale Rubric.

Selected candidates will be elevated to Fellows status at the Fellows Ceremony during the Francine Todd Memorial Honors Reception at the Annual Meeting of each year (September). Elevated Fellows will be presented with an award at the ceremony.




